Online Programs

Two distinct online Post-baccalaureate Certificate Programs with a unique legal emphasis.

The LCP professional certificate program is offered as 114 hours of intensive online modules and one on-site Trial Practice module (22 hours) held in our state-of-the-art courtroom with practicing attorneys, a judge and a jury. The LCP Advanced Practice Professional Certificate program requires the practicing LCP complete 104 hours of intensive online modules.

Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis with program start dates in May and November. Courses are eligible for professional continuing education credit, and award graduate credit at the 500 level. Individual modules also may be taken for continuing education credit.

The Life Care Planner programs are approved by the International Commission for Health Care Certification, certifying body for the CLCP designate.

LIFE CARE PLANNER

Online programs start in May and November with modules occurring monthly. Modules are taught using a unique online classroom format with direct communication between the faculty and student.

What is a Life Care Plan?

A life care plan is a comprehensive, systematic method to determine the individual care need and related costs for someone who has experienced a catastrophic injury, accident or chronic illness.

What Does A Life Care Planner Do?

A life care planner uses a step-by-step procedure/methodology in developing a Life Care Plan. A life care planner is a member of the legal team in medical malpractice/personal injury cases, primarily in the settlement and/ or damages phase. Life care planners also are active in the workers' compensation field, and their use is evolving in other areas of the law. They are independent practitioners in the area of elder care.

Who is Well-Suited To Become A Life Care Planner?

Registered nurses; insurance nurses; occupational health nurses; managed care organization nurses; rehabilitation case managers; physicians; vocational rehabilitation counselors; social workers; physical therapists; and occupational therapists.

Students who have completed the Capital University Law School Nurse Consultant Program are eligible to waive certain Life Care Planner course requirements.

Curriculum

Students must satisfactorily complete the following six modules to receive the LCP Professional Certificates:

- Module I: Life Care Planning Mythology/The Assessment Process/Multiple Disabilities (2 semester hours - online)
- Module II: Medical Rehabilitation Team Process/Referral Sources (2 semester hours - online)
- Module III: Vocational Rehabilitation/Economics, Damages/Structured Settlements (2 semester hours - online)
- Module IV: Capstone Course - Formulating a Life Care Plan (2 semester hours - online)
- Module V: Preparation of a Life Care Plan (1 semester hour - online)
- Module VI: Trial Practice (2 semester hours - online)

Students must satisfactorily complete 8 semester hours from the following modules of their choice to receive their LCP Advanced Practice Professional Certificate:

- Module VII: Medical Research & Writing (2 semester hours - online)
- Module VIII: Civil Litigation/Substantive Law (2 semester hours - online)
- Module IX: Workers' Compensation/Social Security/Disability/MSA (2 semester hours - online)
- Module X: Nuts & Bolts of the Life Care Plan for TBI, SCI & Amputation (2 semester hours - online)
- Module XI: Nuts & Bolts of the Life Care Plan for Pediatric Care & Elder Care (2 semester hours - online)
- Module XII: Creating a Consulting Business (2 semester hours - online)

Faculty

Primary faculty are life care planners certified by the International Commission for Health Care Certification. Additional faculty includes attorneys, economists, health care professionals, neuropsychologists, nurses, physicians, accountants, and vocational rehabilitation professionals.

Admission Requirements & Procedures

Admission Requirements for Registered Nurses

1. Bachelor's degree from an accredited four-year institution.
2. Valid R.N. license.
3. 5000 hours of clinical experience, preferably in a relevant area.

Admission Requirements for Non-R.N. Rehabilitation or Other Related Professionals

1. Bachelor's degree in their field from an accredited four-year institution.
2. Rehabilitation Certification such as CRC, CDMS, COHN, CCM, CRPN, ABVE, LPT, OTL, LPC, etc.; or appropriate licensure or certification in the related field (e.g., social work, physical therapy, etc.).
3. A minimum of 3-5 years rehabilitation work experience.

Please note that preference is given to candidates with a 2.7 or higher grade point average.

Admission Procedures

Applicants must complete an application, and submit the following additional information: (1) original transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate institutions, regardless of whether a degree was completed; (2) resume; (3) three professional references; (4) personal statement; and (5) \$25 application fee. Once all application materials are received, the applicant will be contacted to set up an individual interview. All completed applications will be reviewed by the admission committee.

Tuition Fees and Technology

Eleven semester hours, which includes the preparation of a complete life care plan, are required for completion of the LCP Professional Certificate. Eight semester hours of the modules of your choice are required for completion of the LCP Advanced Practice Professional Certificate. There is a nonrefundable application fee of \$25, an administrative fee of \$135 and a \$100 technology fee. Since the semester hour tuition rate is subject to change, the current tuition rate is available at www.law.capital.edu. Students are responsible for purchasing their textbooks for the program.

Both Life Care Planner certificate programs are eligible for federal financial aid. Due to the distance learning aspect of this program, students must meet certain minimal technological requirements, including basic proficiency in Microsoft Office Suite and have a computer that is less than four years old and dialup connection, preferably a DSL or cable connection.
