Qualifications

The successful applicant will have an earned doctorate in rehabilitation counseling, rehabilitation psychology, or a closely related field of study; be eligible for the Certified Rehabilitation Counselor credential; have at least 2 years of teaching experience in a rehabilitation-related academic program; have strong research skills and a publication record, commensurate with experience, that is appropriate for appointment at a research intensive institution; have strong potential for securing external support for a research program; show evidence of leadership potential; and have commitment to working within an environment characterized by teamwork and cooperation with colleagues.

Duties

The successful applicant will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate rehabilitation coursework; participate in advising and mentoring students, clinical supervision, and course development; function as an active and participatory faculty team member in program planning, research, and service activities; engage in an active program of research, including grant development, and management and participate in service activities at the community, university state, national and/or international levels.
