## Mary Jo Barrett, MSW

Mary Jo Barrett is the Executive Director and co-founder of The Center for Contextual Change, Ltd. She holds a Masters in Social Work from the University of Illinois Jane Addams School of Social Work and is currently on the faculties of University of Chicago, School of Social Service Administration, The Chicago Center For Family Health, and the Family Institute of Northwestern University. Previously, Ms. Barrett was the Director of Midwest Family Resource and has been working in the field of family violence since 1974.

Ms. Barrett has coauthored two books with Dr. Terry
Trepper: Incest: A Multiple Systems Perspective and The
Systemic Treatment of Incest: A Therapeutic Handbook.
She co-created the Collaborative Stage Model (CSM), a highly successful contextual model of therapy used to transform the lives of those impacted by abuse and/or traumatic events.

Her trainings and published works focus on the teaching of the Collaborative Stage Model, systemic and feminist treatment of women, adult survivors of sexual abuse and trauma, eating disorders, couple therapy, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, and Compassion Fatigue.

Ms. Barrett provides consultations, workshops, courses and other training opportunities nationally and internationally to parents, social service professionals, lawyers, mental health staffs, psychotherapists, residential treatment facilities and governmental agencies. Ms. Barrett founded the Family Dialogue Project, which strives to redefine relationships with families impacted by allegations of abuse and trauma.

# Workshop Description

This workshop will provide participants with a greater understanding of domestic violence, as well as how to make an impact for change within the systems it disrupts using the Collaborative Integrative Stage Model. This workshop will present a practical three stage contextual model that will provide clear principles for gathering information, structuring your treatment, and helping you integrate theoretical models and modalities. Participants will be armed with an arsenal of tools for uncovering traumatic origins, negotiating intimacy, creating and respecting boundaries, empowering emotional safety, developing survival skills, conflict resolution, meeting the needs of both partners as a couple, as well as those of family members and individuals. Clinicians will understand which interventions to utilize at the most appropriate moments in treatment.

In Stage One, you'll learn how to create the context for treatment through assessing strengths and vulnerabilities, creating safety and the importance of acknowledgement. In Stage Two, the action mode, the focus is on which techniques and interventions to use for particular symptomatic patterns of behaviors and feelings. Then in Stage Three, you'll learn the most effective ways to help clients consolidate their gains and prevent relapse. Families, couples, and individuals enter therapy after a traumatic event, current abuse, or childhood abuse, with a wide array of symptomatic behavior. The difficulties affect every aspect of their lives. We will explore the multitude of variables that contribute to and create the difficulties. Using up-to-date interventions which integrate neurobiological interventions, Attachment Theory, Cognitive Behavioral Approaches and family systems, you'll come away with a realistic and practical method to organize your treatment that will enable you to handle a wide range of therapeutic situations that are applicable to your own theoretical model for change.
