**Required Qualifications**: A doctorate in Counseling Psychology, Counselor Education, or related field by 8/16/12; an active research program with publications appropriate to rank; and demonstrated excellence in instruction and/or research mentoring as appropriate to rank.

**Desired Qualifications**: Appropriate to rank--Record of successful external funding for research and/or training; record of successful supervision of theses and/or dissertation; and demonstrated experience in working with diverse populations.
