

Assistant Professor of Counseling Department of Counseling and School Psychology Hiring for Fall 2012

The Assistant Professor of Counseling is a ten-month tenure-track, faculty position, which requires excellence in the areas of teaching, scholarship, and service.

Qualifications: Eligible candidates will have a doctorate in Counselor Education from a CACREP accredited program and permanent school counselor certification. Candidates with licensure or license eligible for mental health counseling in NY are desired. Experience working with an ethnolinguistically diverse population and teaching in higher education are required. Experience with CACREP accreditation process is highly desired. Interest and experience in teaching with technology are preferred. Bilingual applicants are encouraged to apply.

Central Responsibilities of Position: Successful candidates will teach a minimum of 18 credits per academic year to graduate students in school counseling, bilingual school counseling, mental health counseling, and marriage and family counseling who are pursuing a master's degree or a post-master's advanced certificate toward a state credential. The curricula include core content in counseling, specialty coursework in each counseling discipline, and specialty practice (practicum and internship) courses. Successful candidates will develop strong classroom teaching practice, conduct research, present and publish their work for peer review, work collegially with department, school, and campus faculty, staff, and administration and will serve the University at various levels in a host of ways.

Applications are invited until the position is filled. Candidates from minority group backgrounds and members of other underrepresented groups are strongly encouraged to apply.
