Ethical Considerations Within The Supervisory Process

Kevin P. Feisthamel, Ph.D., PCC-S, NCC

Dr. Kevin Feisthamel is the Director of Counseling, Health, and Disability Services at Hiram College and has established the College's first counseling internship. He is a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor-Supervisor and Nationally Certified Counselor. Dr. Feisthamel received his Ph.D. in Counselor Education and Supervision from the University of Akron, Master's Degree in Community Counseling from John Carroll University and his Bachelor's Degree in Psychology from The University of Connecticut. Prior to Hiram College, Dr. Feisthamel worked at Portage Path Behavioral Health, The University of Akron, and the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. He has authored and co-authored ten publications (seven peer-reviewed), has provided 45 presentations at the international, national, state, and local levels and is the editorial reviewer for two counseling-related journals. Dr. Feisthamel also received the 2006 Chi Sigma Iota International Research Award for his research on the disproportionate diagnosis of Euro-Americans and African Americans.

Dr. Kara Kaelber, Ph.D., PCC-S

Dr. Kara Kaelber is a Supervising Professional Clinical Counselor. She is an Assistant Professor in Counselor Education at Malone University. She has provided counseling services at a mental health agency and in a faith-based private practice for several years. For the past five years, Dr. Kaelber has been supervising graduate counseling students in their Practicum and Internship courses.
