

Visiting Professor: Counseling – Clinical Mental Health Specialization

The Department of School, Family, and Mental Health Professions at The University of San Diego is searching for a Visiting Professor for the 2013-14 academic year in the Counseling Program (specializations in School Counseling and Clinical Mental Health Counseling).

Qualifications: The individual chosen for this position must meet the following minimum criteria:

- have an earned doctorate from a CACREP-accredited Counselor Education program;
- have experience in and/or show potential for teaching core and specialized courses within the Clinical Mental Health Counseling curriculum;
- be license-eligible in California;
- show evidence of scholarly productivity.

Responsibilities: Applicants will be primarily responsible for teaching clinical mental health core courses and specialty counseling courses in the masters-level Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program. Additional responsibilities include but are not limited to student advising, participating in admissions, curriculum assessment and development, and departmental service. Preference will be given to candidates who can teach basic and advanced counseling courses and supervise practicum courses.

The Department of School, Family and Mental Health Professions at The University of San Diego includes masters programs in Counseling (School and Clinical Mental Health subspecialties) and Marital & Family Therapy. The Department and USD have a strong commitment to diversity. Candidates from underrepresented racial and ethnic minority groups, women, and persons with disabilities are especially encouraged to apply. In addition, candidates with interests and experience in global education are encouraged to apply.

The Visiting Professor will be eligible to apply for tenure-track positions that may open in the future.
