Currently Dr. Lesniewicz is an instructor at Bowling Green State University where she teaches in the Graduate Mental Health & School Counseling Program. She teaches "Integrating Spirituality and Religion into Counseling," based on the 14 spiritual competencies approved by the American Counseling Association. Over the years, Dr. Lesniewicz has taught workshops on a variety of subjects, including Near-Death Experiences, Ethics and Spirituality, and various mental health issues. She has a private counseling practice, The Healing Center, in Northwest Ohio.

Linda Smith, M.A., PC, counsels clients on issues related to grief and trauma stemming from death, divorce, chronic and terminal illness, iob loss, and other life changes and crises. A long-time educator and trainer, she is also the Associate Dean and professor at the Honors College of the University of Toledo.
