Why You Need to Attend

The Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM) is used nationally and internationally to provide standardized criteria for clinical and research use. Release of DSM-5 marks the first major revision to the classification of and diagnostic criteria for mental disorders since DSM-IV was released in 1994.

Jaina Amin, MD, BSN, is a Senior Instructor at University Hospitals of Cleveland at Case Western Reserve. In addition to duties through the adult psychiatry program, Dr. Amin also works at the Cleveland Center for Eating Disorders treating individuals in the partial hospitalization program, intensive outpatient program, and as outpatients. Dr. Amin also currently serves as President of the Cleveland Psychiatric Society. She is a graduate of Indiana University School of Medicine, and completed her Adult Psychiatry training at University Hospitals of Cleveland, and completed a fellowship in Community Psychiatry there as well.

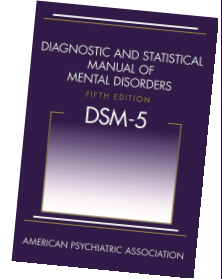
