



**School Counseling Clinical Faculty Position  
Open Rank – 5-year contract**

The School of Education at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill invites applications and nominations for a Clinical Faculty Position in School Counseling. The position may possibly begin as early as July 1, 2014 (negotiable). Annually, it is a 9-month position with stipend for summer program coordination. Summer school teaching is also available.

**Context:** The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, established in 1793 as the first public university in the country, is a doctoral-granting institution in the University of North Carolina system. The School of Education, established in 1886, is the oldest in the South and offers licensure and master's degrees as well as Ph.D. and Ed. D. degrees. The School Counseling M.Ed. program has been accredited by CACREP since 1986. **The Position** has a 3:3 teaching course load including clinical sections of practicum and internship, as well as core courses possibly including human development, research, introduction/ethics, guidance and group counseling. Position responsibilities include clinical and program coordination (e.g., coordinator of field experiences, admissions, program evaluation; leadership in program service and participation in area, school, and university service).

**Qualifications:**

**REQUIRED**

- A) Counselor education doctoral degree (preferably from a CACREP-accredited program) or doctoral degree in a related area and 2 years of previous experience teaching in a counselor education program
- B) Capacity to lead and provide vision as program coordinator (previous experience desirable)

**PREFERRED**

- 1) Commitment to a mission around social justice/equity and strengths-based practice in the context of the ASCA National Model
- 2) Expertise and/or experience with diverse populations (e.g., Latino/a)
- 3) Experience, preferably as a high school counselor (license eligible in NC) and ability to enhance collaborative relationships with local schools
- 4) Availability to coordinate and teach courses in summer
- 5) Experience teaching in higher education, in particular utilizing technology and distance learning
- 6) Knowledge of and experience with CACREP standards

**The Application Process:** Nominations for this position are welcome.
