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The UND Counseling Psychology and Community Services Department consists of 10 full-time faculty, and is housed in the College of Education and Human Development. The Department includes programs in counseling, counseling psychology, recreation and leisure services, and rehabilitation and human services. Current recruitment is for the Counseling and Counseling Psychology programs only. The Counseling Programs offer graduate degrees, including the Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology and MA in Counseling (with Community Mental Health, School, Addiction, and Rehabilitation emphases). We admit approximately 6-8 Ph.D. students, 20 MA students on campus, and 15 MA distance school counseling students annually.
