

**Department of Counselor Education and Human Services
School Counseling Non-Tenure Track Faculty Member Position**

The Department of Counselor Education and Human Services at the University of Dayton is pleased to announce a full-time non-tenure track Faculty position for teaching primarily on our Dublin campus (approximately 80 miles from Dayton). The successful candidate will receive a one-year contract, with the possibility of renewal, in the school counseling program to begin August 16, 2014. Summer teaching may be available. Salary is competitive, commensurate with experience and background.

Responsibilities: The candidate will have had training in school counseling and will be expected to contribute to the continued development and success of the department through teaching, leadership, and mentoring of students. The position requires teaching courses at the graduate level in school counseling on our Dublin and Dayton campuses. Teaching responsibilities may include but not be limited to school counseling specific courses in leadership, consultation, and program development and related coursework. The position also requires the advising of master's students.

Required Qualifications:

- ABD in Counselor Education by August 16, 2014
- Should be license-eligible as a school counselor in Ohio
- Valid driver's license with less than six-points

Preferred Qualifications:

- Earned Doctorate in Counselor Education by August 16, 2014
- Higher education teaching experience
- Potential for scholarly productivity
- One or more years full-time school counseling experience
- Licensed as a School Counselor in Ohio or licensure from a state with reciprocity
- Earned degree from CACREP accredited program
- Potential to provide service to the school counseling program and the department
- Experience with culturally and linguistically diverse learners
- Effective interpersonal communication skills
- Ability to work collaboratively with faculty and students.
