

The Faculty of Counseling and Counseling Psychology (CCP) in the College of Integrative Sciences and Arts on the Tempe campus at Arizona State University invites applications for an Associate Professor with an anticipated start date of August 2017. Specialty areas of teaching and research are open but must be appropriate to counseling and counseling psychology. CCP offers an APA-accredited PhD program in Counseling Psychology and a CACREP-accredited Master of Counseling (MC) program in Clinical Mental Health Counseling. ASU is classified by the Carnegie Foundation as a Research University with highest research activity and emphasizes exceptional scholarship, quality teaching, and professional service.

The successful candidate will be expected to conduct programmatic research; seek external funding to support the research program; teach required courses in both the PhD and MC programs; advise and mentor masters and doctoral students; and provide service to the program, college, university, profession, and community. The Associate Professor position is an academic-year, benefits-eligible, faculty appointment with tenure implications. Salary and tenure are contingent upon qualifications.

- Willingness to assume a future administrative/leadership role in the programs
