## Writing Literature Reviews: A Graduate Writing Retreat

This retreat focuses on writing the dissertation literature review, which for many of us is the most challenging part of the dissertation process. We'll focus on how to determine the scope of the lit review (i.e. when to stop reading!), develop an organizational structure, and craft a compelling argument about the literature. We'll also help you respond to any feedback you've already received. This retreat is designed for writers who:

- have notes or a draft but are unsure about how to proceed or organize the lit review;
- want to learn strategies for completing the lit review more quickly and/or;
- need help addressing the committee's feedback on the literature review.

All retreat participants will receive ongoing support through a Graduate Writing Group.

## **Overcoming Obstacles: A Graduate Writing Retreat**

- need help addressing the committee's feedback.
