Kent State University seeks to fill a position on our treatment team for a Mental Health Provider on the Kent campus. The Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS) office is part of the Division of Student Life and is dedicated to building a caring and supportive staff committed to serving Kent State University students and providing consultation to the university community.

**Mental Health Provider: 12-month**

Candidates with experience working in a university counseling center with counseling college and/or high school-aged populations. Candidates must possess the education and experience required to obtain one of the following: Licensure in the State of Ohio as a psychologist; Licensed Independent Social Worker (LISW); or Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor (LPCC). Two years of experience in a clinical setting. This is a 12-month full-time position that requires flexible work hours, and the salary is commensurate with experience and licensure status. Both experienced and early career clinicians are encouraged to apply.

As a comprehensive student counseling center, CAPS endeavors to create a welcoming and affirming environment for all. CAPS operates within the Division of Student Life, which provides student-focused opportunities to positively enhance students' lives through advocacy, support, engagement, and inclusion. By fostering a student's sense of belonging and supporting their mental health and wellbeing, we support student success, both academically and personally. As such, this role is critical to the division and the university's mission.

Kent State University is an eight-campus public institution with an enrollment of over 33,000 students from all over the U.S and the world.
