Dr. Ruthann Anderson

Ruthann Anderson is an Assistant Professor in the graduate program of Counseling & Human Development at Walsh University, North Canton, Ohio. She holds a B.S. from Ohio University, a M.S. from the University of Dayton, and a Ph.D. from Ohio University. She is licensed as a supervising clinical counselor in Ohio (LPCC-S), and has worked for over 25 years as a mental health counselor, supervisor, agency administrator, and private practitioner. She began serving as a counselor educator in 2009. Her professional interests include: clinical mental health counseling, supervision of clinical mental health counselors, counselor education issues related to multicultural awareness, gender, power, victimization, ethics, and the development of the working alliance between counselor and client.

Nikol V. Bowen is an assistant professor in the department of Counseling and Higher Education at Ohio University. Dr. Bowen is also a licensed professional counselor with experience working in K-12 schools, community agencies, and partial hospitalization programs.
