

National Weather Service Charleston, WV Student Volunteer Program – Summer 2016

Have the opportunity to experience what a career in the National Weather Service entails!¹



What will you do during your volunteer (unpaid) time?

- Gain familiarity with the forecast process for routine NWS public, river, and aviation forecasts
- Apply classroom learning in an operational forecast setting
- Experience real-time severe weather operations at a forecast office
- Participate in external outreach activities could include visiting a cooperative observation site, accompanying forecasters on a storm survey, or staffing a NWS booth at local events
- Gain in depth experience through a chosen focus area Science and Research or Decision Support Services and Outreach
- Present a project corresponding to your chosen focus area at an office sponsored workshop
- Earn academic credit through your university, if offered

What types of students are we looking for?

- College students who are meteorology majors
 - Rising juniors and seniors as well as graduate students will be given preference, but rising sophomores also will be considered
 - o Students who are interested in a NWS or related career
- Students with flexible schedules
 - Volunteers will be encouraged to work at least 2-3 shifts per week with the program designed to last 8-12 weeks
 - Weekday shifts are preferred, but weekend shifts may be accommodated

What does the application process involve?

- Applicants will be required to submit a resumé, transcript (official or unofficial), application form and a brief cover letter that describes their motivation for applying
- Applications will be screened by NWS staff, with interviews for the top applicants

- Applicants will be notified of their status by mid-February
