Campbell University invites applications and nominations for the position of Dean of the (Proposed) College of Osteopathic Medicine. The Dean will lead the effort to gain provisional accreditation from the Commission on College of Osteopathic Accreditation with a goal of admitting the charter class in August 2013. Campbell University is a comprehensive, private, church-related university, strategically located in Buies Creek, North Carolina and within one-hour drive of Raleigh, Chapel Hill, Durham, the Research Triangle, and Fayetteville. The university is comprised of the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business, School of Education, School of Divinity, School of Law, and the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. The College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences includes the Doctor of Pharmacy, Masters and Bachelors of Clinical Research, Masters and Bachelors of Pharmaceutical Sciences and the Master of Physician Assistant Studies programs. The college will be located in a state-of-the-art, new, 70,000 sq. foot facility, with construction slated to begin in the fall of 2011.

Requirements for the position include, but are not limited to: Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree, osteopathic specialty board certification, demonstrated experience in leadership positions in medical education, and support of Campbell University's mission. The successful candidate will participate in the development of a new college of osteopathic medicine with an emphasis on training physicians skilled in comprehensive primary care; provide the vision and leadership for the development of faculty, academic programs, and scholarship in the college; and be eligible for licensure in North Carolina. Other desired qualities include: communication skills, interpersonal and team building skills, ability to work with a diverse group of faculty and students, and effectively represent the college to external and internal constituents.
