|                           | If we are to maximize the full health care workforce, it is<br>necessary to look outside the box and take all workers into<br>account. Interdisciplinary teams have been proposed as a<br>strategy to address health care workforce shortages, lower<br>health care costs, and improve the quality of care.<br>Coordinating the skill sets of each member of the team is<br>hoped to both maximize and enhance the effectiveness of<br>the existing and future workforce. However, discussions<br>and research around these teams focus primarily on<br>doctors, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and<br>nurses. Yet, these clinicians provide care in a larger system<br>and the effectiveness of their care often depends upon<br>other health care workers including pharmacists, dentists,<br>mental health providers, physical and occupational<br>therapists, social workers, community health workers, home<br>health care aids, and even patients and their families.
