Meet our Keynote Speaker

Bradley F. Blackwell

Brad hails from Ohio, but he spent his formative years in North Carolina. He attended North Carolina State University for his B.S. (Animal Science) and M.S. (Zoology), and then traveled to Maine for his Ph.D. at the Univ. of Maine. Orono (Wildlife Ecology). Brad was awarded a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Marine Education and Research Program Fellowship at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, where he modeled downstream migration survival of Atlantic salmon smolts in the Merrimack River. He then took a position as a Research Wildlife Biologist with the USDA Wildlife Services National Wildlife Research Center's Ohio Field Station in Sandusky in 1997. At the Ohio Field Station, Brad developed a research focus on animal sensory ecology and behavior, with a special emphasis on animal detection of and response to vehicle approach (particularly involving birds and aircraft). A part of this research initiative, incorporating avian visual physiology and behavior into aircraft lighting designs, is now a component of the FAA's National Aviation Research Program. Brad currently serves as Acting Field Station Leader and Project Leader for the Ohio USDA APHIS Wildlife Services Field Station.
