Instructions for Submitting Abstracts

DEADLINE for abstract submission for oral presentations and posters is extended to December 14, 2022.

CONTENT Abstracts should include:

- 1. Problem studied or hypothesis tested state why you conducted your study and the importance of your research.
- 2. Results focus on the most important results of your study, while briefly explaining the methods used in data collection.
- 3. Implications explain how the results of this study will advance the understanding of fish and wildlife conservation/management.

FORMAT

- 1. Abstracts should be <300 words in length, excluding title (<15 words in length) and author information.
- 2. Include (*in this order please*) the name, affiliation, email, and mailing address of each author. An asterisk should follow the presenting author's name.
- 3. Use hard returns between the title, author information, and the abstract text.
- 4. Italicize scientific names.
- 5. Please use single spacing, Times New Roman font, size 12 font, and save as a Microsoft Word document.

PLEASE follow the above guidelines as it saves the committee time in editing the final conference program.

SUBMISSION

- 1. Abstract submission via email is preferred. Send abstract as an attachment to christina.monroeswcd@gmail.com
- 2. The subject of the email should read as follows: OWMA Abstract Submission 2022.
- 3. Please indicate if you are submitting an oral presentation or a poster. Also, please indicate if you are willing to display a poster if your abstract is not accepted as an oral presentation.
