

Greek Week Rules

General Rules:

1. Only active and new members (defined as freshmen through seniors + 1 year) on the current roster at the start of spring quarter of the various chapters at Ohio University are eligible to participate in Greek Week. Rosters are due by 2nd Friday of spring quarter or chapter is ineligible.
2. Compliance with all state, local, and Ohio University laws regarding alcoholic beverages and drugs must be followed. Any violation of these rules will be considered a violation of Greek Week rules. Use of alcohol or illegal drugs prior to or during any Greek Week events is grounds for disqualification of the team.
3. If **ANY** member of **ANY** team is found to be intoxicated during **ANY** event, that **TEAM** will be disqualified **IMMEDIATELY** for that event. A second offense will lead to the team's automatic last place overall ranking.
 - a. This rule will apply to Air Bands run-throughs at the individual chapter houses, Air Bands screenings, and the actual day of Air Bands.
 - b. Individuals that are found to be intoxicated will be referred to University Judiciary.
4. All members participate at their own risk.
5. NO CHEATING!

Disputes and Controversies:

1. **MOST IMPORTANT:** if you have a dispute or controversy over a particular event, you have up to **24 hours after the end of that event** to file your discrepancy. You must completely fill out one of the discrepancy forms in the back of this packet and turn into one of the Programming Chairs or members of the Greek Life Staff within 24 hours.
 - a. **AIR BANDS DISCREPANCIES** must be submitted no later than **15 minutes after the conclusion of the final performers**. Discrepancies should be submitted to a member of the Greek Life Staff or a Programming Chair.
2. Each chapter is responsible for selecting one, primary delegate to represent the chapter at all meetings and functions. They will receive all of the information related to Greek Week and should be the only person to speak

with a Programming Chair, member of the Greek Week committee, or a member of the Greek Life Staff. In other words, if there is a discrepancy, the only person from your chapter who is permitted to discuss it with a member of the Greek Week staff is your selected delegate. If a member other than the Greek Week Representative approach a Greek Week staff member about the problem, it will result in the reduction of a team's overall Greek Week standing. Please advise your chapter members to communicate their concerns through chapter representatives.

3. A team's overall Greek Week standing will be reduced for each act of the following unsportsmanlike conduct at the discretion of the Chairs and Advisors. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Harassment
 - Damage
 - Fighting
 - Inappropriate communication to a Greek Week Staff member
 - Any negative acts that occur at any event
4. Disqualification from an event **OR** the entire week can result from, but is not limited to the above list of infractions and decisions are up to the discretion of the Greek Week Advisors.

REMEMBER: Greek Week is about having fun and friendly competition. Our goal is to show the rest of the University how GREAT the Greek Community is! Your conduct represents the image of the ENTIRE Greek Community.

Confronting the Idiot in Your Chapter

Every fraternity and sorority chapter has at least one member whose behavior causes tensions and problems for everyone. The out of control roommate. The brother who gets in fights. The sister who won't pay her dues. Bad grades. Hazing. Abusive drinking. Promiscuity. Drugs. Embezzlement. Bad eating habits. Violent relationships. Damage to chapter property.

Wouldn't our chapters be much happier and healthier if we could confront the members whose bad behavior is bringing everyone else down? Don't we have the responsibility to confront the "idiots" in our chapters? We often allow our friends to risk their own health, safety, relationships or grades with idiot behavior. We are afraid to confront because we fear losing a friend, losing respect or being judged.

In this hysterical, upbeat keynote, T.J. challenges all fraternities and sororities to step to the plate and find the courage to confront negative actions and attitudes from their fellow members. He offers practical strategies for increasing the effectiveness of constructive confrontations.

By encouraging members to confront each other, T.J. gives students a powerful opportunity to put the values of their fraternity or sorority into action. Regardless of the issues facing your Greek system, this keynote will challenge everyone to take responsibility for building a better, more responsible community.

Opening Games: Prepare to Rock

The format of Opening Games this year will be round-by-round elimination (the same as the format used last year). Each round, one team will be eliminated from the competition, with the first team eliminated receiving 9th place points and so on.

The Battle of the Bands theme of Greek Week will be incorporated into each round. Each round will require between 3-6 participants, no more, no less. In order to ensure participation from a variety of teammates, no single team member will be able to participate in more than 3 events, excluding the final round.

The final round will be an "encore performance" and will consist of a best of 3 series for the championship of Opening Games. The first 2 events of the final round will be selected by the teams participating. Each team in the final round will pick one game from a previous round to challenge the other team. If there is a tie after 2 games, one new game will serve as the tiebreaker. The winner of 2 of the 3 possible games will be declared the winner of Opening Games 2011.

Fair play and good sportsmanship are expected as always. Any and all discrepancies throughout the duration of Opening Games will be handled by the Greek Week Committee. All decisions made by the committee are final.

Flag Football

Date: Flag Football - Tuesday May 3, 2011
Time: 3:00 - 6:00
Location: McCracken Field

Rules

Flag Football will consist of a 7 on 7 game between the teams with at least 3 women on the field at all times. Regular games will be played with a running clock and 7:30 minute halves. The Championship Game will also have a running clock, but halves will be 10 minutes each. Greek Week Committee members will be monitoring games; however, it is an expectation that teams will conduct a fair game without need for an official. Unsportsmanlike behavior will result in a deduction of points from the Sportsmanship category as well as potential disqualification from Flag Football.

Game Play/Scoring

There will be 2 automatic blitzes per 4 downs, with no blitzing on other downs. The count will be renewed when the offensive teams gains a 1st down, the quarterback may only run the ball when the defensive team blitzes. Touchdowns will be considered 6 points each with a conversion after each touchdown. Five yards earned in a conversion will be 1 point, 10 yards will be 2 points. If the score is tied when time expires, each team will receive a possession to break the tie. This possession will consist of 2 downs each from the 10 yard line. If after these possessions the game is still tied, this process will be repeated until the tie is broken. In the interest of time, two teams will be awarded 5th place points and two teams will be awarded 7th place points.

Attendance

Attendance will be counted for Flag Football. Wristbands will be distributed from 2:30 pm until 4:00pm. Attendees may begin turning their wristbands in beginning at 4:30pm with collection stopping at the end of the event.

Rules

Games will be played as a 6 on 6 game with a minimum of 3 women on the court at all times. Two games will be played simultaneously using the two courts available at South Green. Greek Week Committee members will be monitoring games; however, it is an expectation that teams will conduct a fair game without need for an official. Unsportsmanlike behavior will result in a deduction of points from the Sportsmanship category as well as potential disqualification from Sand Volleyball. Greek Week committee members will be used as line judges for questionable calls.
