In that position, he has lead a committee to plan "Act, Speak, Build Week," a week-long advocacy campaign for Habitat on Campus.

Since 2008, Joe has also been a volunteer at the **Big Brothers Big Sisters** organization in Athens. Stitt was matched with a boy from New Marshfield and drives there to see him on a weekly basis. During their time together, they play sports and discuss their interests.

The committee plans an annual event in which students stav in cardboard boxes overnight in an effort to bring awareness of homelessness, substandard housing and the need for safe housing. In the past two years the event has raised approximately \$12.000.
